



### IHS goal, objective and interventions

#### **GOAL**

Contribute to the development of a sustainable healthcare system in Kosovo that offers qualitative, affordable and integrated care to patients with NCD conditions

#### **Outcome 2**

Better coordination between primary and secondary levels of care towards integrated health services improves health status of patients with NCD conditions

#### **Output 6**

Health education for noncommunicable diseases implemented in selected General Hospitals

### Why health promotion in hospitals?

Although <u>health promotion</u> is often considered by people to be the core business of medicine, however this is often far from the reality.

Historically hospitals have developed around their ability to support patients' health by strengthening their <u>diagnostic</u> and treatment functions.

This focus has been challenged in recent decades as an effective response is required to counter the rising levels of chronic conditions.


Health education is identified as the best tool to this objective.

Total no of hospitalisations	364




## What is the Health Promoting Hospitals (HPH) Initiative?



- HPH started as a Network initiated by the WHO Regional Office established to promote Ottawa Charter for Health Promotion.
- Health promoting hospitals (HPH) orient their governance models, structures, processes and culture to optimise health gains of patients, staff and populations served and to support sustainable societies.
- HPH is focused primarily on patients and their relatives, with a specific target on the needs of vulnerable groups, hospital staff, the community and the environment.

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### Planning the HPH adaptation in Kosovo



- National Action Plan on Health Education and Health Promotion (HE/HP):
  - To develop an integrated approach aiming to contribute in disease prevention as an intention to reduce health costs.
  - To initiate the involvement of the secondary healthcare level in devising structured Health Education and Health Promotion activities tailored for addressing advanced stages of chronic illnesses.
  - IHS activities have been integrated into the national action plan, contributing to the documentation of valuable experiences and fostering sustainability.

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## Initiating HPH Implementation: Hospital-Level Process


1. Assessment and rational Why the HPH would introduce a benefit to the hospital operating processes

2. Commitment Establishment of working groups at national and hospital lev

3. Need assessment Apply self-assessment tool by building up the closed circle: Data collection - result interpretation – quality improvement plan developed







## Initiating HPH Implementation: Hospital-Level Process



- 4. Five major areas
  - a. Demonstrating organizational commitment for HPH
  - b. Ensuring access to the service
  - c. Ensuring people-centered health care and user involvement
  - d. Creating a healthy workplace and healthy setting
  - e. Promoting health in the wider society
- 5. Monitoring and Evaluation *Performance hospital/project indicators*
- 6. Documentation and Reporting
  To serve as a blueprint for its expansion paving the way
  for broader implementation within SHC

## Current portfolio of HE activities HE Synergy amongst PHC and SHC



- HP for targeting groups (targeting specific groups of chronic patients)
- Health care provider provide HP as a service (motivational counseling)
- Distribute materials in MFMC (cabinets)
- National campaigns on HP/HE TV, radio, social media
- Health caravans deployment of resources in different sites (by engaging NGOs) focusing on risk factors
- Supporting physical activities, healthy diets, marking international health days
