It involves being aware of and sensitive to the ways in which gender can intersect with other factors such as race, ethnicity, socioeconomic status, and sexual orientation to create unique vulnerabilities and barriers.

- screening for cervical and breast cancer.

Men's health concerns:

such as prostate health and sexual health, may also require tailored interventions.
